The Missouri Landowners Alliance is a non-profit, Missouri corporation whose primary purpose is to intervene with the Missouri Public Service Commission in opposition to the proposed Grain Belt Express high voltage transmission line. We are managed by a four-person Board of Directors and officers, none of whom will receive any compensation (other than for out-of-pocket expenses).

Grain Belt is a corporation headquartered in Houston, Texas, which is trying to build a 750 mile high voltage transmission line from western Kansas, across Missouri and Illinois, and ending finally in Indiana. As currently proposed, their line could run through the following counties in Missouri: Audrain, Buchanan, Caldwell, Carroll, Chariton, Clinton, Linn, Livingston, Macon, Marion, Monroe, Pike, Ralls, Randolph, and Shelby.

We need your help in opposing this line at the Public Service Commission, and at each County Commission where Grain Belt might seek permission to build their line.

Missouri Landowners Alliance – Member Agreement

This Agreement is between the Missouri Landowners Alliance (“MLA”) and the party or parties signing below (“Member”).

1. MLA is a nonprofit Missouri corporation formed in February, 2014. Our primary purpose is to oppose the proposal from a Houston, Texas firm (Grain Belt Express) to build a 750 mile high-voltage transmission line across Missouri as a part of its proposed link between western Kansas and Indiana. The focus of our efforts will be at the Missouri Public Service Commission (PSC), and at any local governmental entity which must approve the line before it may be built within its boundaries.

2. Membership in the MLA is open to any person, corporation or other entity which shares our belief that the transmission line proposed by Grain Belt is not in the best interest of the citizens of Missouri.

3. In order to operate effectively, MLA will depend on contributions from its members. Although your contribution is not required in order to become a member, it is certainly needed, and welcome.
